Lorenz. There is some nice solid science in several sections that I quite enjoyed. Most important is the fine third person POV narrative of Cameron, the scene shifts and the dynamic of being at risk and worried about Heather and Earth's survival. In one sense this is a fine 'small town guy makes good' story. In another sense it is a Robinson Crusoe exploration of an alien planet. And finally it is a story about relationships, human and alien.
